

graphed. Juries are off-limits, for example. Photo, too, are minors.

Under the new guidelines, anyone seeking to use an electronic device in the courtroom — attorneys included — would have to sign an agreement to follow the rules. A violation would bring a contempt of court citation, a fine and/or a loss of hand-held privileges. Photos and video would require another permit (allowing even more judicial discretion) and lawyers for either side still can make arguments to the court against allowing cameras. To minimize distractions, judges can appoint a pool photographer, who then would be required to share images with other outlets.

The new rules, open to public comment until Friday, should be implemented. While addressing new realities, the rules should provide uniformity and guidance, while protecting the balance between a judge's ability to deliver justice, a defendant's right to a fair trial and the public's right to know.
